

An e-mail to any teacher is just a click away as the e-mail links are included within this program.

You can also review attendance and past grade information. Most questions are easily handled in this manner, but if you need more assistance, please do not hesitate to contact your child's counselor (see contact information below). Information on how to set up an account can be obtained by contacting the front office.

weapons/look-a-like weapons to



Dress Code Update

wear appropriate, safe,
non-distracting clothing.
Students who wear
clothing with alcohol,
drug, gang, racist, sex
related, or otherwise
offensive sayings or
symbols will be asked to
change their clothing. If
the parent is unable to
be reached, a student

may be offered a loaner shirt in order to expedite the process of them returning to class. Also, clothing such as pants that sag below the waist, bare midriffs, spaghetti straps, strapless and undergarments showing are not acceptable. Hats are not permitted in the classroom. Only baseball style caps are

allowed on campus outdoors, but they must be worn forward. No bandanas, do-rags, beanies or snow caps are allowed. Unsafe accessories such as wallet chains, spiked jewelry, long, heavy necklaces or large belt buckles are not permitted. Thank you.

Interquest School Visits

Please read the following information regarding the District's use of the detection canine program and surveillance cameras as noted on page 34 in the RUSD School Information for Parents, Handbook 2018/19 School Year:

USE OF SURVEILLANCE/ **VIDEO CAMERAS**

In order to maximize the safety of students, staff, and school property, surveillance/video cameras are used in a variety of areas on school campuses. Evidence of vandalism, graffiti, or criminal activity will be forwarded to law enforcement for arrests and prosecution. Recorded events from the surveillance/video camera systems will be used as evidence in discipline matters,



USE OF DETECTION CANINE FOR SEARCHES OF DRUGS OR OTHER **CONTRABAND**

In an effort to keep schools free of drugs, the district contracts

with a vendor to provide specially trained, non-aggressive canines and handlers to assist in determining the presence of substances prohibited by law or district policy. These inspections are random and unannounced. The inspections will be implemented in compliance with all applicable laws and under the provisions of district policy and administrative regulations. Evidence from inspections will be used in student discipline matters and will be forwarded to law enforcement. Interquest will begin visits to schools in RUSD no earlier than

October 2018.

Classroom Interruptions 🖒



In support of our focus on providing the best educational opportunities for our students, we are committed to not interrupting the classrooms during instruction unless it is absolutely unavoidable. In our effort to limit classroom interruptions, we are asking for parents to help by attempting to set the day's plans with your children before sending them to school each day. It's a great opportunity to converse with your child and build organization into your day.

Every time a request is made for a message to be relayed to a student or teacher in a classroom. the secretary in the office must call the classroom. This call goes out into the classroom, even if it may be during important lessons or tests, or even when there are guest speakers. We would like to eliminate the calls and thereby stop interrupting instruction.

We ask you to help us by:

Informing your student before they leave for school in the morning of any plans for after school that they may need to know such as:

- Who is picking them up after
- Do they need to ride the bus or walk?
- Who are they to go home with?
- What to do if it rains?
- Do they have their homework?
- Making sure *lunch* is taken care of by:

- Seeing that they take their lunch with them to school.
- Checking if they have enough money for that day.
- Putting money on the lunch account in advance, so they have money.

If you are going to be picking your student up before the regular dismissal time, please come to the office at the designated time and sign out your child. These are a few suggestions that can help us to eliminate classroom interruptions and keep the important instructional time uninterrupted. Thank you for your anticipated cooperation in this matter.

Attend for Success

Please be sure to call the attendance office or send a note when your student is absent from school for any reason. Absences need to be excused within three days of the absence. This year we will be offering an innovative program called "Saturday for Success." This

program is designed to give students the opportunity to make up critical time at school that was missed because of an unexcused absence, truancy, or illness. "Saturday for Success" is not punitive in nature, but rewards students and parents for taking the

initiative to participate. When students attend the program an unexcused absence, truancy, or illness is removed from the student's attendance record. Please contact the attendance office if you are interested in your student attending "Saturday for Success".

A Message from the Library

The Library at Miller - It's Not Just for Reading

Our library is a beautiful multipurpose facility with thousands of books to read. Students may check out up to three books at a time. If your student is having difficulty finding a book they would like to read, tell them to ask Ms. Ezakovich, Library Media Assistant for help. There are computers and a printer for those times when a teacher simply must have a paper copy of an assignment. We have other activities for our students, including:

3D Printing: Thanks to LCAP funding, there is a 3D printer available for students to use. Students will receive instruction on how to create an object and then will be allowed to print it. There is no charge to use the 3D printer.

Puzzles: There is always a jigsaw puzzle out for students to help put together when they have a few moments. It is fun to see students gathered around the puzzle working together to solve it.

Other Activities:

Legos, duct tape projects, friendship bracelets, and sewing are just a few of the additional activities for all students to participate in.

RUSD Promotion Ceremony Requirements

RUSD passed a set of requirements for participation in 8th grade promotion ceremonies. Please read the guidelines carefully as they are currently in effect and can jeopardize your student's chance at participation.

- 1. The 7th grade class promoting in June 2014 (and every 7th grade class thereafter) will be required to pass 20 classes out of the possible 24 semester classes attempted, or 100 out of 120 credits attempted over two years to participate in the promotion ceremony.
- 2. Passing a class is defined as earning a trimester grade of A, B, C, or D.
- 3. Students receiving an 'F' semester grade will be allowed the opportunity to remain

eligible for the promotion ceremony by passing the failed class with a 'C' or better grade the following semester.

- 4. Students entering a middle school after the start of the school year will be required to pass five out of six possible classes taken for the full semester (s) they attend the RUSD middle school to participate in the promotion ceremony.
- 5. If a student is considered in jeopardy of not participating in the promotion ceremony, an Individual Promotion Plan (IPP) may be completed by a designated school representative, student, and parent. The goal of the IPP is to identify a plan of action that will be taken by all

stakeholders to assure the student's participation in the promotion ceremony.

The purpose of the middle school promotion ceremony criteria is founded on two tenets.

RUSD seeks to:

- Motivate every middle school student to pass all classes.
- Prepare every middle school student for the rigor of high school, college, and career.
